
ANNUAL REPORT



Surpassed the 30,000 acres preserved milestone by protecting another 1,025 acres at El Dorado Ranch.



Achieved 1,882 total acres restored in the American River Headwaters. Volunteers monitored water quality at 18 sites in the Upper Cosumnes River watershed. Staff and volunteer land stewards monitored over 14,000 acres of ARC's owned lands and conservation easements.



Delivered experiential, place-based learning to connect people of all ages with the environment. Hosted 13 new schools and 21 returning schools for field trips.






30,000 Acres Protected in 34 Years
